GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR RECREATION USE OF REGIONAL WATER AUTHORITY LANDS

- 1. The following are strictly prohibited except by written authorization for a specific purpose such as scientific research:
 - a. Swimming in a public drinking water supply reservoir or a tributary for any reason
 - b. Wading in a public water supply reservoir or a tributary
 - c. Littering
 - d. Fires
 - e. Smoking
 - f. Alcoholic beverages
 - g. Cleaning of fish
 - h. Food, beverages, picnicking or camping
 - i. Hunting or trapping
 - j. Pets
 - k. Motorized vehicles (snowmobiles, motor bikes, etc.)
 - I. Bicycling
 - m. Activities on the ice of frozen reservoirs
 - n. Removal of trees, shrubs, flowers or other vegetation
 - o. Vendors
 - p. Disposal of discharge of wastes or other substances into reservoirs
 - q. Carrying of or discharge of firearms or dangerous weapons
- 2. Persons using Regional Water Authority land:
 - a. Release the Regional Authority from all liability relating to their presence on the Authority's property, including liability for personal injury and property damage caused by the Authority's negligence.
 - b. Will obey all orders and directions of Water Authority staff and security.
 - c. Will remain only in the areas designated for recreational use.
- 3. Permitted hours of use: Sunrise to Sunset, unless otherwise specified on the enclosed special permit.
- 4. Parking spaces are available with the applicable recreation permit on a first come basis. Violations are subject to towing at owner's expenses (if parking permit is not displayed in front windshield).
- 5. All permit-holders must be age 16 or older and are required to display a valid Regional Water Authority recreation permit. Persons under age 21 without a permit must be accompanied by and under direct supervision of a permit holder. Permits are not transferable.
- 6. All persons 16 years of age and older must possess a valid Connecticut State Fishing License for fishing.
- 7. Live bait, other than worms, is prohibited.
- 8. Body wastes must be disposed of in sanitary facilities.
- 9. Violation of any of the above rules and regulations may result in revocation of permit and denial of future permits.
- 10. Violation of federal, state, or local laws may result in arrest and prosecution.
